God our Creator, we pray:

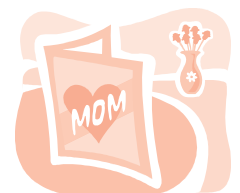
for new mothers, coming to terms with new responsibility;

“God enters by a private door into every individual,” quoted by Ralph Waldo Emerson.

I was raised in the Baptist Church, but for numerous reasons, I never accepted Jesus in my life by being baptized when it was most expected of me. After meeting my husband who was born and raised in a very Catholic family, Catholicism sparked an interest and renewed my sense of wanting to grow my Faith. But it wasn't until I had my daughter, and she started attending Borromeo that I really felt like I was being left behind, and I had a desire to make God part of our entire family.

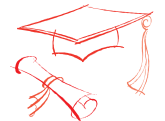
